(A) IST Cruising disposition. - 9.3

1. This command departed Sansapor, New Guinea on 30 December 1944 in command of Task Unit 78.5.5 with assault troops, equipment and supplies of the Sixth Infantry Division aboard in accordance with CTG 78.5 Movement Order 2-14.0 O.T.C. was CTG 78.5, Commander, Amphibious Group Eight. Formation was in column of station units, with IST 614, flagship of TU 78.5.5 in station 3.0 O80. Cruising disposition of IST station unit was as shown in enclosure (A).

4 January 1945 - (S-5) - Following LSTs joined unit off Leyte, taking station in column on starboard side of formation: 746, 673, 919, 619.

8 January 1945 - 0250 - Task Group was attacked by enemy aircraft.

0334 - 0.T.C. gave order to make smoke.

0445 - Enemy plane crashed into port side of IST 912 inflicting slight damage and a few casualties.

0800 - Attacked by three enemy aircraft. Bomb dropped one hundred yards off port beam of IST 614. This unit fired on enemy plane which was later observed to crash into U.S.S. CALLOWAY in transport station unit ahead.

Subject: Action Report, Luzon Operation, San Fabian Attack Force.

9 January 1945 - 0625 - On execution of signal "Deploy", IST 614 left formation with ISTs carrying LVTs.

0750 - Anchored in Lingayen Gulf 6200 yards off Blue Beach.

0810 - First wave of LVTs launched.

0850 - Fifth wave of LVTs launched.

1128 - Beached on Blue Beach with ISTs 614, 555, 628, 581, 582, 700, 740, 667, 919, 741, 631, 777. ISTs 628, 581, 582, 555 and 777 launched pontoons. Pontoons were connected to IST on Blue Beach without difficulty.

10 January 1945

- Remainder of LSTs in 78.5.5 Tractor Unit beached. Surf on Blue Beach was too heavy for pontoons and unloading was difficult. LSTs of Blue Beach Unit were ordered to White Beach for unloading.

1805 - Got underway with LSTs 614, 993, 581, 582, 741, 631, 628, 777, 555, and 919. Commander Destroyer Squadron 23, CTU 79.14.3 as O.T.C. en route to Leyte, P.I.

15 January 1945

- Arrived San Pedro Bay, Leyte, P.I.

2. The launching of LVTs and forming them into waves was accomplished according to plan.

3. The LSTs grounded hard amidships about 100 feet off shore, necessitating the use of pontoon causeways. Sea was calm, with very little surf the first day and early part of the second, during which time the unloading proceeded as fast as trucks could be made available. About 1600 on SUCAR plus one, the surf built up to the extent that pontoons broached and broke away from LSTs.

4. The lack of trucks on SUGAR day to carry the bulk cargo delayed the unloading. Only one IST, the 614, was completely unloaded the first day. Nine LSTs were scheduled to complete unloading on SUGAR day.
