# Part 1 - General Narrative:

1. Sailed from Brunei Bay, Borneo at 1630, 19 June 1945 as a member of Task Unit 76.20.50, conforming to ComLCI(L)Flot-8 landing Attack Order No. 1-45. Our mission was to transport, protect and establish ashore in LUTONG Area of North Borneo, the 2/15 Battalion of the 20th Brigade, 9th Australian Division, and other units designated to participate in the landing. Our cargo consisted of: 12 LVTs, 2 Dukws and 500 troops and officers. This ship carried no bulk cargo.

## Part II - Chronological Order of Events:

2. Sailed from Brunei Bay, Borneo at 1630(I), 19 June 1945 and arrived off LUTONG, North Borneo at 0630(I), 20 June 1945. 0740 - let go the bow anchor 600 yards west of the line of departure and commenced trying to cast off LCT 1310, which this ship had in tow. 0750 - This ship was rammed by LCT 1310 and a hole of about six inches square was put in our hull at frame 58 some ten feet above the water line. 0755 - Cast off tow. 0820-Commenced discharging 2 Dukws and 12 LVTs. 0832 - Haval gunfire bombardment commenced. 0912 - First wave dispatched for the beach. 0914 - Second wave dispatched. 0917 - Third wave dispatched. 0926 - Fourth wave dispatched. 0928 - Signal given to shift fire inlend off of the beach. 0930 - First wave hit the beach virtually unopposed. 0955 - Commenced loading reserve troops in LCVPs. 1042 - All LCVPs returned from transporting reserves to beach. No casualties were suffered by either personnel or boats. 1445-began reloading LVTs. 1614 - Completed loading LVTs. Crimson Beach was secure and this ship was ready to depart upon orders
