3. OWN TROOPS

- (a) 9 Aust Div less 26 Aust Inf Bde Gp is to capture and hold the area LABUAN Island - MUARA Island - BRUNEI PENINSULA - BROOKETON with a view to subsequent capture of area BRUNEI BAY - SERIA - LUTONG - MIRI to permit the establishment of an advanced fleet base in BRUNEI BAY and to protect oil and rubber resources of these areas.
- (b) 24 Aust Inf Bde Gp is to capture LABUAN Island; destroy enemy forces on the island and prepare for further operations in area BRUNEI BAY - BEAUFORT.
- (c) At the same time, 20 Aust Inf Bde Gp is to land and capture area BRUNEI BLUFF - BROOKETON - MUARA Island.

4. TROOPS UNDER COMMAND

- 9 LAA Bty, 2/3 Aust AA Regt less two troops.
- 8 Aust Svy Bty less two troops.
- 2/5 Aust Fd Svy Coy
- Det HQ "B" Aust Naval Bombdt Group.
- No 6 SFCP "B" Aust Naval Bombdt Group.
- No 8 SFCP "B" Aust Naval Bombdt Group.

INTENTION

- 5. 2/8 Aust Fd Regt will support 20 Aust Inf Bde in the landing and capture of the area BRUNEI BLUFF - BROOKETON - MUARA Island.

METHOD

6. SUMMARY OF ASSAULT LANDING

- (a) Simultaneously, landings by 2/17 Aust Inf Bn Group on Green Beach and 2/15 Aust Inf Bn Group on White Beach to secure BROOKETON and MUARA Island to enable remainder of Bde Group with stores to land on YELLOW Beach.
- (b) 2/13 Aust Inf Bn Group as Bde Reserve are initially afloat and to land on cell.
- (c) 2/15 Aust Inf Bn is to provide a detachment to be landed from small craft on banks of BRUNEI RIVER, vicinity sq 5240. 16 Fd Bty will provide Recce Party with this detachment who will recce suitable gun areas and advise if 1 or 2 troops can support this detachment.

7. COMMAND

- (a) CO 2/8 Aust Fd Regt will command all arty units of 20 Aust Inf Bde Group.

(b) When RH₁ is established ashore, all arty units under command and Bn Groups for landing, revert to command 2/8 Aust Fd Regt and remain in support of Bns.

(c) When H₁ RAA 9 Aust Div is established ashore on LABUAN Island, arty units 20 Aust Inf Bde Group come under command of CRA and remain in support of Bde Group.

- 12. FIELD ARTILLERY

(a) 1 troop (75 mm) 58 Fd Bty lands by flotation equipment on GREEN Beach under command 2/17 Aust Inf Bn.

(b) 58 Fd Bty less one troop will land YELLOW Beach. On landing, 53 Fd Bty will assume control of 75 mm troop and Bty comes under command 2/17 Aust Inf Bn.

(c) 15 Fd Bty will land one troop WHITE Beach and one troop RED Beach under command 2/15 Aust Inf Bn for landing; and will support operations of 2/17 Aust Inf Bn Group.

Subject to requirements of 2/17 Aust Inf Bn, 15 Fd Bty will be available to 2/15 Aust Inf Bn.

15 Fd Bty will support 2/15 Aust Inf Bn in the event of a counter attack endangering the security of RED Beach.

(d) 16 Fd Bty form part of Bde reserve on call to land where ordered on RED or YELLOW Beach.

16 Fd Bty will be required NOT before J plus 4 hrs to move by craft to a position to be captured by BRUNET RIVER detachment formed from 2/15 Aust Inf Bn. (Possibly 2/13 Aust Inf Bn)

13. LIGHT ANTI-AIRCRAFT

TASKS

(a) Protection of bench installations and gun areas MUARA Island.

(b) After closing of RED Beach protection of beach installations and gun areas YELLOW Beach - BROOKETON.

Before closing of RED Beach, one section may be sent to YELLOW Beach.

Where possible light AA guns will be included in disposition for seaward defence of beaches.

LAA landed on RED Beach under command BC 15 Fd Bty for landing.

14. SURVEY

8 Aust Svy Bty and 5 Aust Fd Svy Coy will commence survey in areas secured by 20 Aust Inf Bde Group as soon as possible.

15. S F C P

No 6 SFCEP under command 2/17 Aust Inf Bn for landing.

No 8 SFCEP under command 2/15 Aust Inf Bn for landing.

Will support Bns by observed naval gun fire at completion of Bombardment programme.

Det H₁ "B" Aust Naval Bombdt Group will move in USS "SPENCER" with 20 Aust Inf Bde H₁s.

16. AIR OP

Auster strip to be prepared by Engineers on MUARA Island and BROOKETON.

Two Auster aircraft allotted.

50 % of sorties for Air OP and Arty/R.

15 Fd Bty will make available one OPO to fly immediately strip is ready.

One troop 15 Fd Bty to answer air call.

Authority to fly Air OPs will be given by RH₄.

17. LOB GROUP

LOB Group consisting of 3 officers and 50 ORs under command Capt L J BAXTER will move in assault convoy in LCIs' 636 and 701.

LCI 701 - 2 officers and 39 ORs land RED Beach.

LCI 636 - 1 officer and 11 ORs land YELLOW Beach (or RED Beach if YELLOW Beach not clear).

Capt Baxter will command RED Beach Det and will act as Beach Control Officer under command Beach Group on RED Beach.

Lt Rapley will command YELLOW Beach Det and report to Major Snell 2/15 Aust Inf Bn for instruction.

TASK

Unloading of craft landing on RED and YELLOW Beaches.

All large craft are to land RED Beach, guns, vehicles and stores for YELLOW Beach are to be trans-shipped into smaller craft.

Lt Power will command Follow-up convoy.

18. SECURITY

Sub-units and det will be responsible for the protection of their own areas.

Perimeter defences will be established, listening posts and booby traps constructed.

Maintenance sigs and other detached groups will not move without a protective det.

Sub-units will be responsible for the notification of booby traps to all ranks.

19. GUN AREAS

as per Appendix "D".

20. ALTERNATE POSITIONS

Btys will receive alternate and night firing positions.

21. F.O.O

15 Fd Bty will provide one FOO party (six personnel) to land with one troop of 58 Fd Bty on GREEN Beach.

TASK

To give support to 2/17 Aust Inf Bn from 15 Fd Bty on MUARA Island.

FOO will be under command BC 58 Fd Bty.

FOO will set up No 11 set at 75 mm position and be prepared to shoot 75 mm troop if necessary.

Two FOO's 16 Fd Bty to land GREEN or YELLOW Beach if 16 Fd Bty is landed on MUARA Island.

Tasks will be advised later.

22. REGIMENTAL SURVEY

Btys to be placed on Regt grid, and later Theatre grid^{established} by 5 Aust Fd Svy Coy.

RSC to establish CB Office.

23. HARRASSING FIRE

Harrassing Fire Tasks will be co-ordinated and no tasks fired without authority of RH₄.

24. DF AND SOS TASKS

Btys will be responsible for establishing their own DF and SOS Tasks in the initial stages of the assault.

Tasks to be reported to RHQ.

When Bde assumes control, tasks will be / by RHQ.

26. "Z" DAY To be advised later.

27. EMBARKATION Embarkation Instructions issued separately.

No vehicles or stores to be put aboard that are NOT shown on Loading Tables.

DW Tons allotted to sub-units will NOT be exceeded.

Vehicles and guns will NOT be loaded beyond capacity.

No stores other than gun stores will be loaded on guns.

All packages will NOT exceed a two man load, except approved bulky equipment that cannot be broken down.

28. NATIVES

Natives found in unit lines will be held under guard until transferred to Native Compound at Beach-head area.

29. MALARIAL PRECAUTION

Full malarial precautions will be taken.

Sub-units and units under command will report to RHQ at 1815 hrs daily that malarial precautions have been taken.

30. ADMINISTRATION See 2/8 Aust Fd Regt Adm Order No 1.

31. INTERCOMMUNICATION

32. WIRELESS SILENCE

(a) Wireless silence on Z Day will be maintained by all army stations until one hour before H and J Hours.

(b) On Z Day listening watch will be maintained from two hours before H and J Hours.

(c) Emergency messages will be passed through naval channels prior to breaking of wireless silence.

(d) After wireless silence is broken it will be re-imposed or broken again only by means of appropriate codewords.

33. COMMUNICATIONS FOR AIR WARNING

(a) When the force is ashore, air warning will normally be given by telephone. Appropriate action will be taken on receipt of following codewords :-

FLASH BLUE	Enemy or unidentified planes approaching.
FLASH RED	Enemy air attack imminent.

33. Communications for Air Warning (para cont)

FLASH WHITE All clear.

(b) Under such conditions the following control terms may also be relayed :-

CONTROL GREEN All guns will hold fire except in case of direct attack and then only automatics including light AA will be used.

CONTROL YELLOW All guns engage hostile aircraft independently.

34. PYROTECHNICS

The following pyrotechnic signals will be used between ground troops and aircraft :

(a) By ground troops

Meaning

Aust 2 inch multi star
Green Artillery fire or bombs falling within our lines.

(b) By aircraft

2 star Red Display front line panel. Air attack about to commence.

2 star Green My mission has been completed.

Six white flares,
parachute Mk 6. First wave 500 yards from beach.

35. CODE WORDS

(a) Code words for phases of the operation in Appendix F.

(b) Code words for places and features in Appendix F.

(c) Code words in Appendix F will be used only within 9 Aust Div and will NOT be used in communications to Allied Naval and Air Forces.

36. CODES AND CIPHERS

(a) Until 0700I Z plus 3, combined assault code CCBP 0130 Series DOG 25 will be used for local communications with Allied Forces, RAN and RAAF for all messages which require enciphering.

(b) As from 0700I Z plus 3, TRENCODE will replace combined assault code CCBP 0130 for communication to battalion and equivalent H₄, Commando squadrons and field batteries.

(c) As from 0700I Z plus 3, combined Field Code CCBP 0129/3 with CCBP 0121/D1 will be used for communication with Allied Forces, RAN and RAAF.

(d) RT Code No 2 will be used by AUST Army units for all RT conversations during the operations. Key words/key letters issued through signals.

(e) Current appointments code in Signal Training Pamphlet No 5 will be used.

(f) Distribution of cipher keys and documents through signals.

37. PASSWORDS

Issued separately.

38. SIGNAL SECURITY

(a) All messages transmitted by wireless will be encoded or enciphered where it is considered that the enemy can take action on them in time if they are sent in clear.

(b) Existing civil and military communication systems in the objective area will NOT be used until approval is obtained from RH.

(c) Strict attention will be given to security in telephone conversations.

39. TIME ZONE

(a) ITEM time will be used. Zone suffix I.

(b) To determine time for this zone, 9 hours will be added to GMT (US - GCT) or one hour subtracted from AUST Eastern Time.

40. NETTING OF WIRELESS SETS TO FREQUENCIES

(a) Frequency Standards. Station WTO (USA Army) BRISBANE operating on 5,000 Kc/s and 15,000 Kc/s continuously.

(b) All sets will be netted on the Near Shore as follows:

(i) Control stations will be placed on frequency by frequency meter prior to netting of groups.

(ii) Sets will be "warmed up" prior to netting.

(iii) All dial readings will be noted and details affixed to the sets.

(iv) Dials will be locked either by locking nuts or by "jams" inserted with care between dial and face of set.

(c) Netting check will be carried out immediately wireless silence is broken.

(d) Further netting check will be effected on embarking in small craft and on arrival ashore.

41. FREQUENCIES

(a) See Appendix G.

(b) Frequency will be changed only by appropriate code word issued by Signals.

(c) Frequencies remain fixed until 0700I on Z plus 3 after which normal daily change begins.

42. R/T CODE KEYWORDS

(a) Keyword - Keyletter.

First Reserve - FRANCISMODEL/B

Second Reserve - PULYORHEADIN/F

(b) Reserve Keywords will NOT be used without authority of RH.

(c) Any compromise or suspected compromise will be reported to RH without delay.
